- Highway Access:Two area residents have come forward and offered to assist Chris Burger and Gerry Anderson
with the Highway Access Project efforts to proceed with presentations to the Government. As both
Chris and Gerry are away at the moment, it is anticipated this committee will be able to advance their
efforts as a Committee on this important project in the very near future.
- Park Progress and Community Centre: Alf Jablonski reported the Regional District of Nanaimo has no new information on progress for the Community Centre project. He also indicated there is no information on future development Phases for the Meadowood Community Park.
- <u>Special Events (Halloween):</u> Organization of this event is proceeding well, with requisitions/approvals in place for almost all sectors. Follow-up later this week should solidify a couple of outstanding items. As extra community volunteers are needed this year, a concerted effort will be made to elicit the help of additional members of the neighbourhood.
- <u>Neighbourhood Emergency Preparedness:</u> We were fortunate to have weathered the recent storms this past week with less severity of damage than forecast. As a gentle reminder, we are attaching Emergency Preparedness Information for all residents to review and investigate (Exhibit "A"). Be prepared and BE SAFE!
- **<u>Fundraising:</u>** As we have lost a significant fundraising source this year, we are accelerating our efforts to generate revenue to be able to provide continued community support. The Park is a key component of our efforts, to expand the Park facilities and fixtures. Additionally, we will be requiring fundraising to secure furniture, fixtures, etc. for the new Community Hall project. Details of our ideas and efforts are being ironed out, for decisions on the best avenues of fundraising we should tackle first.

<u>Media & Communication:</u> Allyson Wight reported that she has been successful with both radio and newspaper media for our upcoming Corcarnival Halloween event. The PQB News interviewed her for an upcoming article. The "Beach" and The "Lounge" radio stations will both be running announcements twice a day from Oct. 24th to 31st advertising our Halloween Event.

 - Clear your rain gutters and all exterior drains to ensure they are functioning. (see attached provincial info)
- Reduce landslide risk.
 - Refrain from directing drainage down a bank or dumping vegetative debris as they tend to destabilize a slope
- Voluntary evacuation.
 - Optimal if extreme weather is anticipated leave time for options or to deal with challenges
- When you leave.
 - Turn off utilities, secure propane tanks.
